

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of family, or any male over 18 year old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba Sas katchewan or Alberta. The applican must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each, of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing, may pre-empt a quarter-ection alongside his homestead. Price 3.60 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon 2 a homestead.
