PRESIDENT MCKINLEY IS SHOT DOWN BY A JUDAS-LIKE ASSASSIN

THE HAITIEN ATTEMPTS IN FRIENDSHIP, THE OTHER AIMS AT ORDER

NIEMAN CHOSEN BY REDS LEFT DETROIT RECENTLY

Police Believe Would-Be Assassin of President McKinley Went From Cleveland, Where He Was Located of Late—His Real Name Leon Czolgosz.

Detroit, Sept. 6.—At 7 o'clock to-night the local police department started out to look up Nieman, the would-be assassin of President McKinley. Details of officers were sent out to investigate every man by that name in the city directory. The police are also looking for Malto Meyer, the rabid Socialist, who created a riot recently by denouncing the dead Governor Piore on the Campus Martius, and was nearly mobbed thereafter. Nieman was thought now to have belonged to Meyer's group of Socialists, and Meyer will be closely questioned as to his possible connection with the would-be assassin.

At 11:15 p.m. the police had learned definitely that Nieman was of German descent, a blacksmith by trade, and had always resided in or around Detroit. He was in the city up to a month ago, when he disappeared, leaving no trace as to his whereabouts or probable destination. The police believe he was selected from a national society of "Reds" to assassinate the President.

SELECTED TO DO THE DEED.
Buffalo, Sept. 6.—(10:15 p.m.)—Nieman said to a detective to-night at Police Headquarters that he was recently in Cleveland and had been selected to kill President McKinley.

REAL NAME LEON CZOLGOSZ.
Buffalo, Sept. 6.—(12 a.m.)—The police have just learned that the real name of the would-be assassin is Leon Czolgosz. He was born in Detroit and came here from Cleveland.

INJURED BY A CYCLES.
Ottawa, Sept. 6.—Mr. J. Travers Lewis, a well-known local lawyer, son of the late Archbishop Lewis, Chancellor of the Diocese of Ottawa, was badly injured internally by being struck by a bicyclist to-day. Mr. Lewis is suffering severely, but will recover.

Two Bullets Took Effect, One in the Left Breast and the Other in the Abdomen, Penetrating the Stomach and Necessitating a Delicate Operation.

Buffalo, N.Y., Sept. 6.—Just a brief 24 hours ago the newspapers of the city blazed forth with pomp and head-line type, "The President Day in Buffalo's history."

Milburn of Buffalo, president of the Pan-American Exposition, chatting with the President and introducing to him especially persons of note who approached. SECRETARY IN CHARGE TILL THE WORST COMES

Col. Sewell Expresses His Pain That Anyone Would Attempt the Life of the Greatest Living American—All Toronto Was Dazed by the News.

Col. Sewell, the general American consul of Toronto, was with President McKinley at the International Hotel, Niagara Falls, N.Y., yesterday afternoon and left him at 2:30 o'clock. In conversation with the World last night he said that both the President and Mrs. McKinley were in the best of spirits at that time, and he only heard of the attempt on the President's life as he was leaving Niagara Falls for Lewiston to take the boat for Toronto.

The Colonel has been personally acquainted with the President for over twenty years, and when the news reached him of the shooting he was nearly prostrated. He cannot understand how any person should attempt to kill the first man in the nation.

Cheered at the Falls.
The Colonel participated in a procession held at Niagara Falls yesterday in honor of the President, and says that Mr. McKinley was received on all sides by shouts of joy and scenes of enthusiasm. Later the President took the boat for Lewiston, and seemed delighted with everything he saw.

Secretary of State in Charge.
The Secretary of State will take charge of affairs now and remain in charge until the worst comes to the worst, the President gets better. KING KILLING.
The trade of chief magistrates becomes more and more dangerous. Whether he be the Car of an empire or the President of a republic, the cowardly assassin lurks on his trail, and a little more actively on the trail of a President than on the trail of an Emperor! Within 35 years three Presidents of the United States have been shot, two of them fatally, Lincoln and Garfield, and perhaps McKinley's wound is fatal. Within this same time a President of France, a President of Spain, have been assassinated, a Czar of Russia, a King of Italy, an Empress of Austria! How many crowned heads and chief magistrates have had their lives attempted in that time cannot say. The Kaiser of Germany must have had three or four escapes.

THE ROUGH RIDER.
Vice-President Roosevelt becomes a figure of the first magnitude. Were Mr. McKinley to die, Mr. Roosevelt would succeed for the balance of the term—more than three years. Johnson succeeded Lincoln, and Arthur succeeded Garfield, automatically and not by election. The liability of the Vice-President to be called to the succession has suggested more than once a change in the person of the Rough Rider.
