

Bu Hamara at Last Rounded Up by the Sultan.

Paris, Feb. 4 .- A despatch from Tangier says a special courier from Fez has brought a renewed report that the pretender of the throne, Bu Ha-mara, has been captured.

Paris, Feb. 4.—A later despatch from Tangler says that while pursuing the pretender's forces the Sultan's cavalry was attacked by the Kista tribesmen, was attacked by the Kista tribesmen, but the other troops of El Moabhi, the War Minister, came up in time to par-ticipate in the fighting, and the result was another victory for the imperial army, with heavy losses on both sides. The remainder of Bu Hamara's follow-ers are reported to have been captured.
