Sin Wilfrid Laurier had said that a civil servant who took an active part in elections took his official life in his hands, and other Liberal leaders had laid down the principle that a civil servant must not be an active parti-

san.

This principle had been grossly violated in Manitoba. In the local elections of 1896 Martin Jerome, an official of the Interior Department, drawing \$100 a month and expenses, had been nominated for a constituency and had been elected a member of the legislature. He resigned temporarily, but was reinstated and held both positions for three years.

Mr. Roche cited many similar cases, and concluded by moving an amendment regretting that the government had allowed so gross a violation of the principle laid down in 1896.

Mr. McCreary replied that Conservatives in Manitoba had been guilty of similar practices, and also that the Roblin government had introduced the spoils system on a gigantic scale. The Maple Leaf Club in Winnipeg had insisted on some dismissals of civil servants, which involved great hardship and injustice.
