MODEL FOR PEACE TERMS

London, June 3.—"The peace concluded with Rumania should serve as a model for the general peace terms to be concluded by the central powers," says the Nachrichten of Munich. "Germany has found a method of making conquered countries share her enormous war burdens without actually inflicting a crushing war indemnity. This method consists in enforcing on them a stipulation for preferential treatment to be accorded to Germany over a long period, so that Germany may be fully supplied with goods she needs. "In this way Rumania will furnish the central powers with wheat and petroleum on advantageous terms for ninety years. A similar happy solution must also be adopted in all peace treaties to be concluded in the future."
