

CALCUTTA, British India, Feb. 23.-Chinese troops to-day entered Lhassa, the track. the capital of Tibet and the residence of Dalai Lama, the supreme head of ger were killed, and it is feared a numthe Lamaist Hierarchy, who upon the approach of the soldiers fled with several of his ministers into India.

Serious trouble has been anticipated owing to the action of the small Chinese army which, marching from Szechuen, China, subdued Eastern Tibet, levying contributions on the Lama's mouth Island station. people, and showing no respect for the nonasteries.
The Tibetans, resenting the desecra-

tion of their holy places, petitioned the Chinese foreign board, praying that the Emperor of China interfere in the interests of the Buddhists. The petition was disregarded as the Chinese propose to make the administration of the country purely Chinese. Dalai Lama appealed to Lord Minto,

When the Chinese troops were reported as moving from the Province of Khan ostensibly to strengthen the garrison at Lhassa, the Lama hastily quitted the capital and proceeded toward Barjiling.

NEGRO'S WANTON CRIME Opens Fire on Party of Young Students on Train.

NEW YORK, Feb. 23. - Harrison Highee and Leslie Lord, two young Yale graduates, and socially prominent n North Jersey, were wantonly shot o-day by an infuriated negro in the smoking car of a Jersey Central train in which they were riding to their homes in Newark.

Accompanying Higbee and Lord were Gale Young, of New York, and his cousin, Roger Young, of Newark, both Princeton graduates. Soon after the train left Jersey City, the negro, who was accompanied by another man of his race and a mulatto veman, accused the four young college men of making remarks about the woman. Lord was about to reply but Highee told him to keep quiet. "Don't you tell me to keep quiet,"

yelled the negro as he leaped to his feet and drew a revolver, "I'll quiet you," and he opened fire on the four young men. Roger Young leaped for the negro who was so powerful that he dragged Young with him to the platform. cung held on, however, and when he negro leaped from the train while was making twenty miles an hour. Young went with him. In striking the

embankment, Young's grip was brok en and the desperado disappeared.

STUDENTS CENSURED CURZON

For Preferring Politics to Duty, So He Resigns Rectorship.

GLASGOW, Feb. 23.-Lord Curzon of Kedleston has resigned the rectorship of Glasgow University. Last week the university students held a meeting and adopted a resolution of censure against the lord rector for postponing his installation ceremony in favor of his political engagements.
