VOTES FOR WOMEN COMING IN BRITAIN

Equal Franchise Will Be in Effect at Next General Election.

LONDON, Aug. 18 .- The present week brought within range of practical week brought within range of practical politics a reform which many of its advocates feared the war would post-pone perhaps for a generation-the right of women to vote. The strong-est force against the realization of woman suffrage in the years im-mediately preceding the war was the determined opposition of Premier Asquith, hence his virtual conversion, when he said in the house of commons on Monday, that the undertaking of new franchise and registration reforms new franchise and registration reforms in the midst of a great war was too complex and controversial a problem, and implying that any new bill for franchise reforms in the future must, of necessity, include women, was a great surprise

great surprise. The premier's announcement is talked of on all sides as meaning that women will have the vote before another general election is fought, except in the unlikely event of an election being forced upon the coun-try before the war is ended.

According to The Nation htere have been other similar conversions among men of great influence and, altho Earl Ourzon still remains a strong op-ponent of the women's cause, together with some others, men of all parties realize that the capacity and willing-ness to help in the national cause as displayed by the women during the war have removed the last obstacle to their receiving political recognition. 
ernment to grapple with the problem of adult suffrage without delay on the ground that the coalition government and calm the fears of the house of lords as no Liberal government could.
