ROYAL NAVAL COLLEGE OF CANADA.

The Royal Naval College is established for the purpose of imparting a complete education in Naval Science. Graduates are qualified to enter the Imperial or Canadian Services as midshipmen. NEW YORK TEACHERS

Will Get a Raise

State to Levy Direct Tax and Also Vote \$5,500,000 Additional.

Albany, April 5.—Wage increases for teachers thruout the state have been tentatively agreed on by the legislative leaders who have been trying to solve the teachers' salary problem.

According to the tentative arrangements, a total of \$25,000,000 is to be set aside by the state this year to aid to a great extent in meeting salary increases of teachers. Thirteen million, three hundred thousand dollars is to be raised by a direct state tax on real estate, \$5,500,000 is to be appropriated outright by the legislature, and \$11,000,000 is already available.

Of this total New York City will get \$16,000,000. The city will have to contribute \$2,000,000 in addition to its present contributions for teachers' salaries.

The increases which have been tentatively agreed upon will be \$700 for teachers in New
