Ottawa a day or two ago we briefly discussed this matter with him.

He advised us that he was cognizant of serious objections that his departmental officials would raise to the establishment of an Indian community at this location, recommended by Mr. Laurie in his report, for the reason that the location is deep into a forest reserve, and stated definitely that the land at this location was not available for sale either to us or to any other applicant at the present time. Mr. Tanner did not, however, close the door to negotiation and it is suggested that at the first opportunity you take the matter up with his Deputy Minister, Mr. Harvie, and the staff of his Lands Branch. I am enclosing a memorandum prepared by Mr. Allan, Superintendent, Reserves and Trusts, making certain suggestions as to how the matter might be furthered.

You will note that Mr. Allan's suggestion is that a representative of the Alberta Lands Branch and Mr. W.B. She ad go into the district in the early summer and report on the local situation and make a tentative selection of land which we might ask the Province to sell to us.

It appears to this office that first of all we must be fully apprised as to the location and
