MANY CASUALTIES, FEW RECRUITS

Only Sixty six Enlisted in Province Last Week—St. John County Third.

Five recruits were secured in the city yesterday. They were as follows:—George Martin, Albert county, 62nd C. D. F.; S. D. Gamblin, Kings county, Canadian Engineers; A. Stockwell, England; Edward Garner, England, Machine Gun Section; H. C. Henderson, New Brunswick, No. 9 Siege Battery.

Mrs. James W. Olmstead, of this city, on Saturday received official word that her son, Private Claude T. Olmstead, had been wounded in the head and hand and had been admitted to hospital at Stomer, France. Private Olmstead formerly belonged to the 140th Battalion. He volunteered in England for a draft which was being sent to a famous New Brunswick unit at the front, and crossed to France after being out of Canada only nineteen days. He had been in the trench seven months. He was wounded on May 2.

Private James Dolan, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Dolan, of Newville, was killed at Vimy Ridge, official information to that effect having been received on Friday. Private Dolan was twenty-six years of age, and prior to enlisting was the commercial travelers' platoon of the 14th Battalion, was a traveling representative of J. J. Turner & Sons, Peterboro (Ont.) Besides his parents, six brothers survive.

General McLean, O. C. troops in New Brunswick, and Major Jones, G.S.O., will inspect the 236th overseas battalion here tomorrow. The inspection is believed to forecast the timely departure of the unit from Fredericton. A feature of the inspection will be the presentation of the military medal to Lance-Corporal Moore, of Queensbury, who is now home as the result of wounds.

Private Lee J. Donovan, unfortunately, did not arrive in the city last night, as was expected at his home, 627 Main street, but in all probability will reach St. John some time today. Private Donovan has seen more than two years' service and, contracting rheumatism, was lately invalided home.

Private Donovan has two brothers in the army. Private Clint, who was recently admitted to Kitchener Hospital, suffering from injuries sustained during the big drive at Vimy Ridge, and Private Harold, who was wounded during the big battle at the Somme, and who is now convalescing in a hospital in England.

BOARD RE-ELECTED

At the annual meeting of the Protestant Orphans' Home yesterday the board of directors was re-elected.

In her annual report, the secretary, Mrs. J. S. MacLaren, said that there are now forty children, twenty boys and twenty girls in the home. Their health has been good and, for this, thanks are due to the physicians and dental surgeons who have given of their services.

The children were well remembered at Thanksgiving and Christmas and the school closing had shown them to be making excellent progress in their studies. Credit was given to the matron, Miss Frost, and her assistants for their care of the children. During the year, the home was visited by Mrs. Flynn, of Boston, who, as a child, had resided in the home at the time when the aunt of the present matron was in charge. Mrs. Flynn presented \$10 to be spent for the enjoyment of the children.

The entire board of directors was re-elected for another year. The retiring officers, who were re-elected, are: President, T. H. Estabrook; vice-president, J. A. Lyle; second vice-president, Mrs. D. McMillan; secretary, Mrs. J. S. MacLaren; and treasurer, H. C. Rankine.

THE LIQUOR CASES.

The two cases on the charge of violation of the provisions of the Prohibition Act ended yesterday afternoon in the police court with the result that fines were imposed in each charge. Jung was given his freedom on payment of \$100 and Isaac Wehber was fined the minimum penalty of \$50.

In the case of the latter the court found that, owing to the fact that two Halifax men, Max Konein and Herman Komenska, testified that the liquor was theirs and the defendant had nothing to do with it, outside the fact it was stored on his premises, all tended to produce mitigating circumstances, and the minimum fine was imposed. The magistrate, however, held the proprietor of the premises responsible under section 7.

Mr. Mullin, representing the defendant, asked that under the existing circumstances of the case the liquor be returned to the owners. His honor did not for the moment look with favor to this point of view, but fixed a date, on request of Mr. Mullin, to hear argument on this point involved.
