THE WESLEYAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, Montreal, was founded by the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada in the year 1873. In 1878 it was, by order of the General Conference of the former Methodist Church of Canada, incorporated and affiliated with McGill University. It is one of four Protestant Theological Colleges in Montreal affiliated with this University, and the second of them in point of attendance and equipment. In 1883 there were finished the commodious buildings which it now occupies. It has acquired from Parliament the power of conferring degrees in Divinity. No degrees in Course are given without attendance at lectures. Its work includes the following curricula :

- I. Preliminary Course, as prescribed by the General Conference.
- II. Matriculation Course, as prescribed by the University.
- III. Course in Arts, as prescribed by the University.
- IV. French Course, as prescribed by the General Conference.
- V. College Course for Probationers, as prescribed by the General Conference.
- VI. Course for the degree of S.T.L., as prescribed by the Senate.
- VII. Course for the degree of B.D., as prescribed by the Senate.
