### WOULD CONFISCATE ROYAL PROPERTY

Bill Presented to Reichstag is Opposed By The German Cabinet

BERLIN, April 26.—The cabinet, acting in accordance with the constitution, has submitted to the Reichstag a bill for the confiscation of the property of the ex-rulers.

This was demanded by 12,500,000 voters in a preliminary plebiscite.

To indicate its disagreement with the bill the cabinet appended a declaration charging that confiscation without compensation of the entire possessions of the rulers, as demanded in the bill, runs counter to the principle which must underlie every legislative act in a state founded upon law.

The declaration announces the government's determined opposition to passage of the bill by the Reichstag and adds that a compromise bill is being drafted by the government parties which will constitute an acceptable substitute.

The compromise bill which is nearing completion calls for indemnification of members of the former reigning houses.

### RETRIAL ORDERED

Convicted Slayers of British Woman in Mexico Have Execution Delayed

MEXICO CITY, April 26.—The Mexican Supreme Court has ordered retrial of the two men accused of the murder of Mrs. Rosalie Evans, wife of a British subject, who was assassinated on her ranch in the State of Puebla in 1924.

This automatically stays execution of the death sentences pronounced against Aleja Garcia and Francisco Ruiz. The Supreme Court held their first trial null and void because of technical errors.

### Prominent British Magnate Is Dead

LONDON, April 26.—Sir Fenwick Shadforth Watts, chairman of the shipping federation, died here yesterday. He had been president of the Chamber of Shipping of the United Kingdom, and principal representative of the ship owners on the National Maritime Board. He was born in 1858.

### Chinese Opera Is Produced In Milan

MILAN, April 26.—The premiere of "Turandot," the Chinese opera of Puccini, was produced at the Scala theatre last evening before a distinguished and critical audience. The auditors, comprising numerous artists and music critics from Europe and America, gave hearty approval to the score and scenic beauty of the setting. The opera was sung under the baton of Arturo Toscanini.

### SWITZERLAND HAS WHEAT MONOPOLY

Government Adopts Plan to Regularize Prices and Stabilize Bread Values

GENEVA, April 26.—A government wheat monopoly has been established in Switzerland as an aftermath of war legislation.

Less than one-tenth of the country's demand is produced in Switzerland. The rest is imported from the United States, Canada and the Argentine at competitive prices. The monopoly will regularize prices through the licensing

of importers and the stabilizing of bread values.

A similar monopoly is expected eventually in France unless the coming international economic conference results in some system of redistributing raw materials. Louis Loucheur, who will be one of the French delegates at the conference, is urging the necessity of international control of raw materials. He declared France last year imported over 35,000,000 bushels of wheat which absolutely fixed the price of the domestic product.

LONDON, April 26.—Obviously referring to the Prince of Wales and his South African trip, "The World" newspaper declares that "a member of the Royal Family was in imminent danger of assassination by a tribe of aborigines some months ago."
