### Russia Plans To **Export 3 Million** Tons of Grain

Berlin, July 20.—(A. P. by Mail).—
Russia's grain exportation this year is a burning question for Germany, which must buy a large portion of its breadstuffs abroad. Contracts are already reported to have been made by German organizations for 40 million gold marks' worth of Russian grain, chiefly rye. This transaction is said to have been financed jointly by the German Government, the German industrialists and the German bankers.
