Mrs. Nellie McClung, Noted Canadian Writer, Claimed the Universe Suffered from Too Much Masculine Rule -Said Prohibition Neces-

If the world is ever going to be made a better place to live in our new civilization must centre on the child and concentrate on its welfare. This was the remedy to the social and political status of the world advanced by Mrs. Nellie L. McClung, member of the Legislature of Alberta and noted Canadian writer, when she spoke to over three thousand people in St. Andrew's Church, Westmount, last night.

said Mrs. McClung, "if I were as young as some of you here tonight, Iwould devote it entirely to work among the children, that is the only way to save the world. The incorruptible heart of the child is the material we must work on. Anything can be done with a child. And it is with the women com-

"The world today suffers from much masculine rule," continued and McClung. "From the men who McClung. Implanted in the woman's heart is the protective spirit and the coming of the wo-

men into pushe life is the solution.

Prejudice Removed.

Mrs. McClung began by saying that she remembered the day when there was a great deal of prejudice against women speaking, especially on politics. In countries, thousands of miles away, the formula had been haid dayn that it was formula had been laid down that it was of women." She resented the term; it looked as if they had been asleep, but the truth of the matter was that the mothers of yesterday had been too busy with household affairs. When the men set up factories and all kinds of labor saving devices the woman came into her own and she had now come to stay to take a hand in the affairs of the world. While the men had used their ingenuity, Mrs. McClung went on, to main and kill and destroy, the women had brought the spirit of protection, the influence of peace without which the world could never hope to be anything but a place of strife and battle. While in England she studied the system of Continuation Schools, as operated by the London County Council. She had asked a woman connected with these schools what would be her solution of the unenployment and unrest which prevailed everywhere. The answer had come:
