Audacious clipped a fifth of a second from Man o' War's record for the mile in winning the Mineola handicap at Belmont Park, June I. The new record is 1.35 3-5. This feat astounded track experts, but Audacious proved he was a real stake horse when three days later in the Suburban handicap, at a mile and a quarter, he beat Mad Matter in the sensational time of 2.02 4-5. Audacious is a five-year-old.


