Carpentier's Plans.

New York, Aug. 27.—George Carpentier, world's light-heavyweight champion, will sail for the United States either December 14 or 15. Word to this effect has been received by a friend of the French boxer. In a letter Carpentier wrote that he expected to participate in two bouts in London and would arrange for his departure for America on December 14 or 15. His London bouts, Carpentier wrote, would be against Frank Moran, Pittsburgh heavy-weight, Joe Beckett, English heavy-weight, or Roy McCormick, English light-heavyweight champion. Negotiations now are in progress for a Morant-Carpentier battle, and it is likely that either Beckett or McCormick will be selected to face the French boxer in his second engagement before sailing for America to meet Tom Gibbons, St. Paul light-heavyweight.
