

WANTED FOR DEATH OF MISSIONARY

Chinese General, However,
Reported Escaped to Japan.

Peking, Nov. 10.—(A. P. Correspondence.)—General Chang Ching-yuan, whose troops murdered Rev. W. A. Reimert, missionary of the Reformed Church Mission, at Yochow, last June, and for whose trial and punishment the American Legation has been pressing the Chinese foreign office, is reported to have escaped from China and gone to Japan. In response to the legation's representations, the Chinese authorities had ordered the arrest of General Chang, and he was alleged to be in the custody of General Wang Chan-yuan, military governor of Hupah, pending trial. He already had been required to pay over to the mission an indemnity of \$45,000. The legation is now informed that General Chang has secretly left China.

SPARRING PARTNERS WHO COME AND GO

New York, Dec. 10.—Jack Dempsey, heavyweight champion pugilist of the world, is still industriously engaged going through a daily routine of training stunts in preparation for his bout with Bill Brennan, the Chicago heavyweight, at Madison Square Garden on Dec. 14.



The big champion is a most energetic worker during his preliminary stunts for every bout in which he engages and his co-workers are subjected to the severest tests.

Dempsey has a mighty corps of assistants, including Bill Tate, who serves as his first string mate during the roughest of the work. There has been a varied list of sparring partners, but most of them have deserted under fire. It is a certainty that Dempsey will be a well-conditioned man when he meets Brennan.

BLAMES THE PARENTS FOR JUVENILE CRIME

Judge MacBeth Says They
Don't Restrain Children or
Keep Them at School.

London, Ont., Dec. 10.—Judge Macbeth at the opening of the County Court session here declared that the list of cases of juvenile crime is the worst he has ever been called upon to deal with. Parents, he said, are very largely to blame for this state of affairs, because they neither restrain their children, nor keep them at school. One serious obstacle to corrective effort, he said, is the fact that the law provides reformatory sentences as the only penalty for juvenile crimes. He asked the Grand Jury to make a recommendation as to some other means of punishing or correcting delinquents. Forty children have been in the local courts within a few months charged with serious offences.

Clark gave an interesting address on his visit to England when he attended the Masonic celebration of peace in that country. The address was illustrated with a fine series of lantern slides. Mr. Clark also showed some pictures of rescue work which were of special interest from a missionary viewpoint. Rev. W. R. Robinson presided. 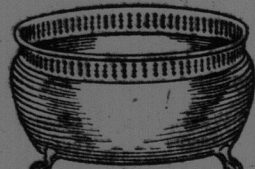

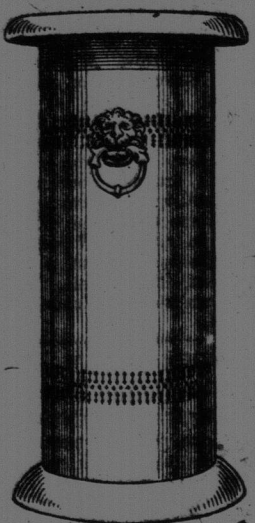

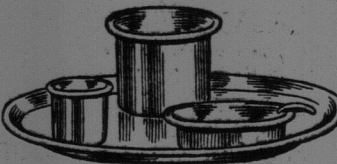
