CRITICISE FISHER'S PAVING PROGRAMME

Pointed Remarks by R. W. Wigmore M. P. at Rotary Club Meeting—Dr. Gray Speaks on Asphalt

At the meeting of the Rotary Club in Bond's restaurant, where dinner was served, last evening, R. W. Wigmore, M. P., presided and a special address was given by Dr. R. E. Gray of Toronto, representative of the Barber Asphalt Paving Co., of Philadelphia. Previous to the meeting the Rotarians assembled in the Unique Theatre and witnessed the presentation of a picture showing asphalt in Trinidad and Bermuda and the process of getting it to market. Rotarian Wigmore in an address opposed the paving of City road and Brussels street next year, saying there were other streets in greater need of it and besides these had not water and sewerage pipes in good condition. He thought the Rotarians should protest to the common council against the work. Dr. Gray spoke on paving matters and produced an apparatus which allowed each of the members to get a good look at pictures of the Trinidad asphalt. He explained the difference between natural and artificial asphalt and said that the best natural ones came from two lakes, Trinidad and Bermudez. Dr. Gray's address was heard with keen interest by the gathering.

A nominating committee was appointed, consisting of H. S. Culver, F. Lewis, D. Merritt, P. D. McAvity, and Roy Thomson, and a stunts committee of E. A. Scholfield, Dr. Spangler and K. J. MacRae. E. Clinton Brown was chosen as a representative to a conference with Dr. Roberts on health education. Songs by Robert Ritchie and others were well received. Rotarian F. N. DeLeon reported \$708 collected in connection with the \$1,500 required for St. John's share in the national education movement. The following were proposed and accepted as members of the club: H. G. RAISE \$90,000 FOR ORANGE ORPHANAGE

In the neighborhood of \$90,000 has been collected for the Loyola True Blue and Orange Home to be built on Yonge street, just outside Richmond Hill, Toronto. The True Blues have purchased there a site for the building of 35 acres at a cost of \$15,000. Among the large subscriptions received by the grand treasurer, W. M. Fitzgerald, are \$20,000 from W. H. Bandfield and \$5,000 from Sir Edward Kemp. While the home is to be erected by the order, its doors will be open to orphans who are not children of members. The cost of the home is estimated at \$250,000.

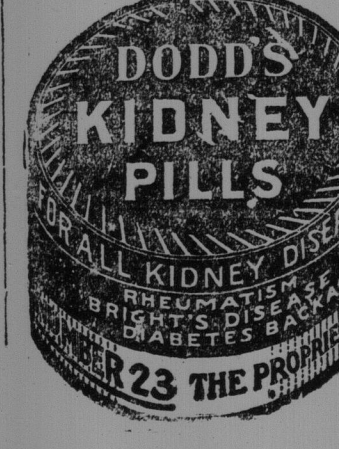
A VITAL PROBLEM.

(Halifax Echo.)

At the recent meeting of the diocesan mission board, Archbishop Worrell presiding, Archdeacon Armistead brought to the attention of the board the serious condition now prevailing in many districts throughout Nova Scotia, where the children are denied the means of obtaining an education, owing to the death of teachers. Many schools along the shore are closed, and there is the risk of an uneducated people, and the young are heavily handicapped in beginning life. Archdeacon Draper spoke most feelingly of the state of affairs in Cape Breton, where many children are without the rudiments of knowledge. Rev. J. W. Godfrey of Truro asserted the whole trouble of the negroes of the world is due to the neglect of the teaching profession and said that the normal school had the smallest number in attendance for many years.

The archbishop said that the subject was one of paramount importance, and that some definite action must be taken. It was decided to ask his grace to confer with the leaders of the other churches, and to invite their co-operation in approaching the government. Canon Simpson of Charlottetown pleaded for the same object in Prince Edward Island, as the teachers were being invited to other fields, and attractive offers of remuneration made to them in the west. A strong resolution was submitted to the executive committee to the provincial government.

Three of the C. N. R. civil engineers had a narrow escape yesterday afternoon from being hit by the Halifax express. They were going east on a gasoline car when they discovered the train a short distance in front of them. Not having time to stop they jumped and escaped with a few scratches. The car was smashed.
