real estate, personal estate, and income which is contained by the American Federation of Labor, an organization that has long been strongly opposed to prison labor in manufacture. real estate, personal estate and income, which is assessable under the Saint John City Assessment Act, 1909, and hereby give notice that blank forms on which statements may be furnished can be obtained at the office of the Assessors, and that such statements must be perfected under eath and filed in the office of the Assessors, within thirty days from the date of this notice.

EXTRACTS FROM "THE SAINT JOHN CITY ASSESSMENT ACT

32. The Assessors shall ascertain, as nearly as possible, the particulars of the real estate, the personal property, and the income of any person who has not brought in a statement in accordance with their notice and as required by this law, and shall make an estimate thereof at the true value and amount, to the best of their information and belief; and such estimate shall be conclusive upon all persons who have not filed their restatements in due time unless they can show the test with members and in becoming producing and useful members of the community.

43. No person shall have an abatement unless he has filed with the assessors the statement under oath within the time required; nor shall the Common Council in any such case sustain, an appeal from the judgment of the Assessors unless they shall be satisfied that there was good cause why the statement was not filed in due time as herein provided.

It is proposed to make adequate return to the prisoner for his work by a fair wage but in receiving this the prisoner becomes responsible up to the limit of his capacity for any dependents that he may have and who will not be longer a charge to the state or community.


