MIND RESTORED AFTER 14 YEARS

Victim of New York Thugs Had Since Lived Under Another Name

Seattle, Oct. 25.—S. Chandler Rogers was attacked by three men at Eighth avenue and Sixteenth street, New York, May 1, 1897. He was thrown into the Hudson river after his skull had been fractured, but he was picked up, and wandered about the world for fourteen years under the name of George Kelly. He has just been restored to himself here after an operation on his skull.

As George Kelly he served eleven years in the United States navy. Then he worked at Port Blakey and was married there two months ago. Recently he disappeared and was found three days later in the forest crawling on his hands and knees and snapping like a dog. He was brought to a hospital here, apparently paralyzed. A operation was performed to remove a piece of the skull.

Kelly has written an intelligent letter to his half-sister, Miss Florence Douglas, 418 West Thirty-Second street, New York. He signed the name S. Chandler Rogers.
