

Situation Never So Satisfactory in First Half of July—Trade is Booming. Winnipeg, July 12—The crops have now reached the stage where the wheat is heading out in most districts. Temperature has been high, and the soil is in the best condition for growing grain. Many districts had showers of rain, and in the territories devoted to agriculture there is hardly a section that has suffered from lack of moisture. IMPORTANCE OF PLAYGROUNDS

(Christian Science Monitor) That the playground propaganda in the cities is of imperative importance and something to which citizens should lend their influence is proved, the Christian Science Monitor thinks, by certain figures presented at the child welfare exhibit held in New York a few months ago. To make the conviction more impressive exhibits in the form of pictures as well as various articles and objects—even sculptures—brought home to the beholder what things are existing today in this civilization to make suffering and perhaps future sorrow for little children. The special exhibit shown was a screen with five photographs showing children in the city streets, playing ball and other games on the streets, and also children begging transfers from trolley car passengers and children peddling. In all 717 children were arrested in the month, and of these arrested children, 100 were taken to the city's crowded parts, but surely the value of perfectly good lots and valuable in the possible extension of our cities so as to allow more space everywhere.
