

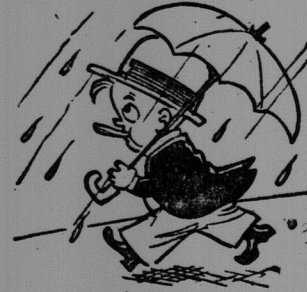

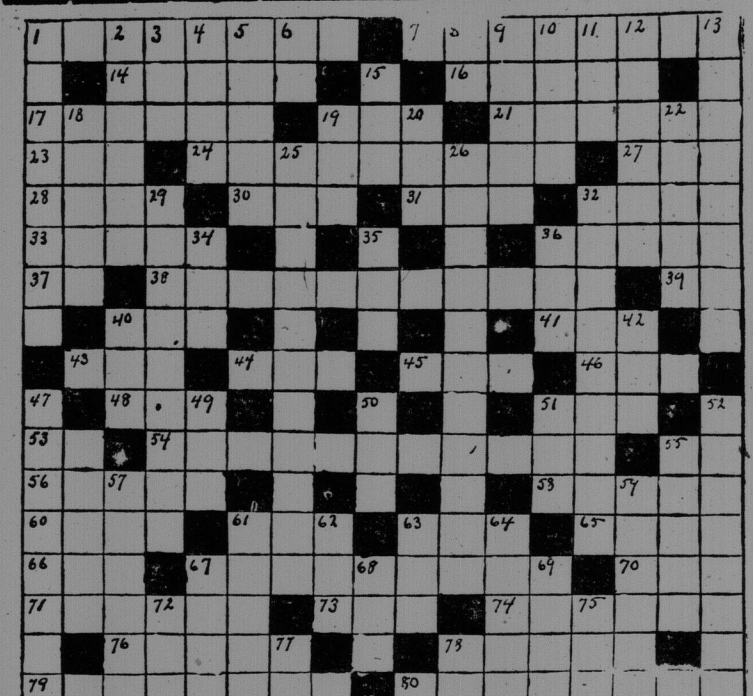
Features Lace And Satin

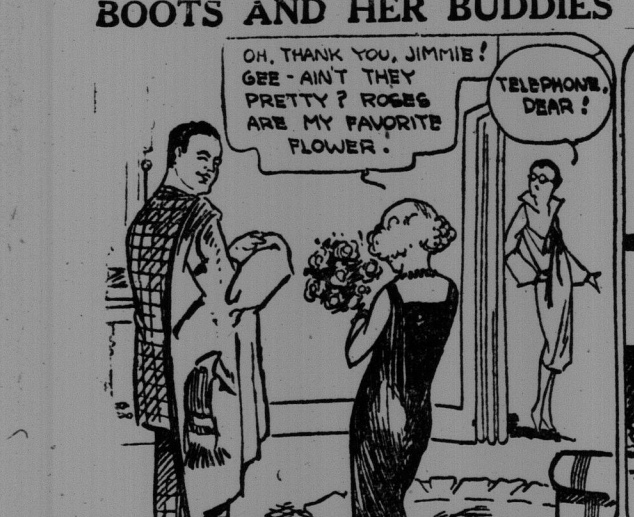

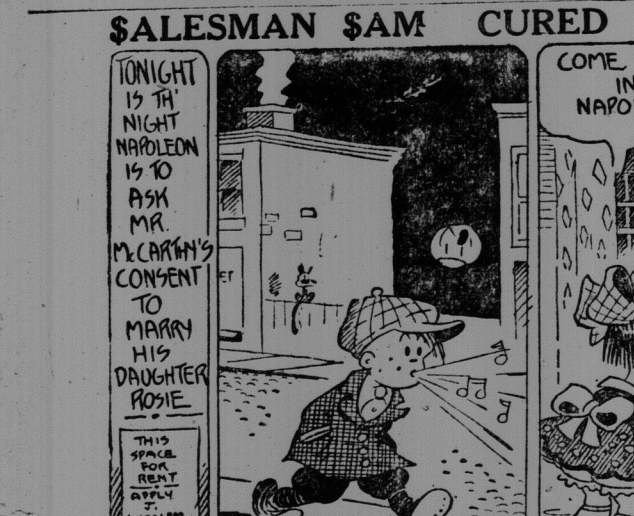

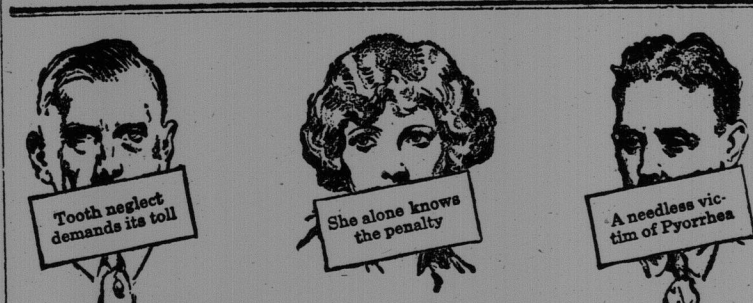
