1926 I received a letter from my  
mother asking for about one  
hundred dollars: knowing I

Batterey Funds I left on the  
night of the 14<sup>th</sup> August 1926 &  
went to Indian Head, Sas.

After sending my mother  
seventy five dollars I was ~~left~~  
unable to return as I  
had not sufficient money and  
owing to rain I did not go to  
work again for about three  
weeks ~~owing to rain~~. As  
soon as I had acquired  
enough money I returned &  
surrendered myself to the  
Main Gate Police about 9 pm  
the 24<sup>th</sup> October 1926.
