

In 1911 he accompanied Sir Robert Borden on his western tour. He vigourously opposed the Taft-Fielding reciprocity pact, and it was on the defeat off the Laurier administration, that he was appointed Minister of Labor, resigning that post in 1918.

If railroads paid attention to the varial road business, and did not become involved in other enterprises, their unproductive capital investments would be decreased, said Dr. Frank Warne, economist, on behalf of the railroad transportation employees, before the senate committee on interstate commerce.
