

JAPANATTHEFAIR Handiwork and Products of the Oriental Empire.

SKILLFUL WORK OF JAPS IN IRON. Carving and Is Valued at \$10,000-Patience a Big Stock in Trade in the

World's Fair, July 25 .- [Special.] -Japan has contributed splendidly to the World's Columbian exposition. Seventsen years ago the artisans and producers of the Oriental empire made a display of their wares at Philadelphia, and were so much gratified at the reception which cy met there and with the market for neir goods which was immediately opened up in the western world, that without urg-ing on the part of the representatives of this exposition they were eager to repeat here their effort at the Centennial, only enlarging it a dozen fold and enriching it with a class of fine ware which is not often sent beyond the borders of their own coun-try. The Japanese government, not to be

outdone by the enterprise of its merchants, made a liberal appropriation, and the manufacturers' associations of Yokohama, Nagasaki and other cities, corresponding closely to our boards of trade, and the associated the companying cooperated in the sociated tea companies, co-operated in the

handiwork and products as was never be-fore seen on this continent. Now for the irst time large masses of the American people are given their first opportunity to see Oriental work that is really fine. Most of that which we have beretofore een in this country has been of a rather heap order, though of course graceful and popular. Here we have if not the very best the Japs can do an approximan of their best, and that is surprisingly ood and artistic. One's feeling is, after nding a few hours among the Japanese producing more meritorious work, and is rather discouraging to be told by one I the Japanese commissioners that as a pater of fact their very choicest pieces in ly all lines of effort were left at home we the dangers of the long voyage and
