Madison, Wis., Dec. 3.—State Fire Marshal T. M. Purcell in a statement today said that his department has collected evidence which shows the existence of an "arson trust" operating in Wisconsin and other states for a number of years. He added that warrants have been issued for the arrest of several of the alleged principals most of whom live outside of Wisconsin. The setting of fires was carried on, according to Mr. Purcell, in conjunction with a band of adjusters of fire losses.

Richmond, Va., Dec. 3.—In the name of the State of South Carolina Governor Bleasie served notice to the governors' conference here today that lynchers of negro assailants of white women in his state would go unpunished. Governor Bleasie warmly defended his use of the pardoning power as well, declaring that in twenty-two months he had pardoned or paroled approximately 400 persons and that he hoped the number at the end of the second term would be 500.

There is a rumor in Sofia that a suggestion has been made to substitute Greek troops for those in the Balkan league. It seems clear from the report that Bulgaria will ignore the army of Greece, and to send her feet to attack the Dardanelles, that the relations between Greece and Bulgaria are greatly strained, and these signs of dissension among the allies leave the situation full of danger.

London, Dec. 3.—The protocol arranging an armistice was signed late this evening by the Turkish and Bulgarian plenipotentiaries, the latter representing also Serbia and Montenegro. Prior to this there had been a long sitting of the Turkish and Bulgarian plenipotentiaries to consider fresh proposals submitted by the allies.

Apparently the Greek delegate did not sign the protocol. At present nothing is known on this point, nor of the terms of the armistice as revised to-day. The refusal of Greece to sign the armistice is unacceptable of different interpretations. In the first place as a tacit armistice has been in existence for more than a week already, it is not impossible that the negotiations may have served to bring about an agreement on the general principles of the peace terms, such as would provide the speedy arrangement of a peace treaty when the conference meets, as is now expected in London.
