Z., Aug. 27.—Relief arrived just in the nick of time to save the lives of Dr. Douglas Mawson, the Australian Antarctic explorer, and his five companions, who were left in March last on Macquarie Island, in the Antarctic Ocean, when the remaining 24 members of Dr. Mawson's expedition returned to Tasmania.

FATAL FINISH TO PETTY QUARREL

Wrangle Over Kitchen Duties, between Employees of Toronto Hotel, Leads to Death of Lucy Ives.

Toronto, Aug. 27.—As the outcome of a petty quarrel over some kitchen duties at Smith's Hotel, Queen and Simcoe streets, this morning, the body of Lucy Ives lies in the morgue and James Dickinson is in a cell at police headquarters, held responsible for her death.

The tragedy was witnessed by three other domestics, whose story is to the effect that Dickinson was seated at a table eating his breakfast when the woman came in and told him that the cookman had just arrived and was depositing the tea on the table.

He refused on the ground that he wished to finish his breakfast first. She kept on badgering him, repeating the asking him to go out and bring the tea in, but he turned a deaf ear to her and kept on with his breakfast.
