Small Investors Will Get Square Deal.

Toronto, Nov. 22.—Commenting to night on the assured success of the Canadtan \$50,000,00 war loan, Hon W. T. White, federal Minister of Finance, said that after a four thousand mile trip through Canada, during which he had had ample opportunity of sounding the sentiment of the country, he was convinced that the loan would be largely over-subscribed. By dispensing with the underwriting, which costs one and a quarter per cent, meaning a saving of \$625,000 the government was able to offer the loan to the public at an attractive price. The lists would be kept open, he said, until he was satisfied that the rural communities and the small investors had had a fair chance of subscribing. These need not be deterred by the generous subscriptions of banks and other financial institutions. The government had reserved the right to reduce these subscriptions and the small investors would receive the first consideration.
