Now, therefore, I George Washington, President of the United States of America, having seen and considered the Treaty and Additional Article aforefaid, do, in pursuance of the aforefaid Advice and Consent of the Senate of the United States of America, by these Presents, ratify, accept and confirm the faid Treaty and the faid Additional Article, as the same are herein before set forth.

And I do moreover hereby declare, that the faid Treaty and the faid Additional Article form together One Inftrument, and are a Treaty between the United States of America and His Britannick Majesty, made by the Prefident of the United States, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate thereof.
