Was captain of sailing vessels for seven years. Is Capt. and Adj. 3rd Regt. Guysborough militia, and Consular Agent for the U.S. and Lloyd's agent at Guysborough. First returned to Parlt. for Guysboro', March 1874, on resignation of sitting mem. Re-elected at g.e. 1874. Called to L.C. 1878. A Reformer.—*Guysborough, N.S.*

FRASER, *Hon.* JAMES, *J.P.*

Descended paternally from the Frasers of Farraline or Foyers, and maternally from those of Gorthlic. B. in Boleskine, Inverness-shire, Scot., 7 March 1802. Came to N.S. 1804, where, and in N.B. he was educated. M. 1826, Elizabeth, eld. dau. of Rev. Peter Gordon, of New Glasgow, N.S. Has held a commission in the militia of N.B. and N.S. Called to L.C. 1867. A Conservative.—*Drummond Cottage, New Glasgow.*

MACDONALD, *Hon.* JAMES SIMON.

Eldest s. of the late Robert Macdonald, of Halifax, N.S., formerly of Dornoch, Sutherlandshire, Scot. B. at Halifax, N.S., 7 May 1837. Ed. at Dal College, Halifax. M. Grace, dau. of Jas. Thomson, Esq., of Halifax. Called to Leg. Council, Dec. 1878. Was Presdt. of the North British Society, Scottish National, 1873. A Captain of Militia.
