CHAUVEAU, *Hon. PIERRE JACQUES OLIVIER, LL. D.*,
Q. C. [*County of Quebec*.] C.

Ancestors were early settlers at Charlesbourg, near Quebec. B. in Quebec, 30 May, 1820. Ed. at the Quebec Seminary. M. 1840, Miss Masse, of Quebec. Called to the Bar, L. C. Augt., 1841. Created Q. C. 1853. A well known French Canadian *littérateur*; author of *Charles Guérin*; *roman de mœurs Canadiennes*; &c. Is a corresponding mem. of the Academy of Natural Sciences (New Orleans), a mem. of the Council of Public Instruction; and of the Board of Agriculture, L. C. Has been President of the *Institut Canadien Français*, Mont.; and of the Literary and Historical Society of Quebec. Was Solicitor General, L. C., from Nov., 1851, to Augt., 1853;—and Provincial Secy., Can., from latter date to Jany., 1855, when he retired from office, and in same year was appointed Superintendant of Education L. C., an office which he held from that time until the Union. Called upon to form the first local Govt. under the “British North America Act of 1867” for the Province of Quebec, July, 1867; and was appointed Provincial Secretary and Registrar, and Minister of Education, offices which he still holds. Sat for, present seat in L. A., Can., from 1844 to July
