senerous, and a brave nation, with the most vigorous exertions.

In conclusion Mr. Pitt moved,

" 44 That an Humble Address be presented to His Majesty, to return His Majesty the Thanks of this "House, for his most gracious message, acquaint-Fing this House of those circumstances relative to "the capture of British vessels on the North-western # Coaft of America, and to the conduct of the Court of Spain on this occasion, which have induced "His Majesty to give orders for making such prepa-"rations as may put it in His Majesty's power to act " with vigour and effect in support of the honour of " His Majesty's Crown, and of the interests of his 46 people; and to affire His Majesty, that we shall "readily proceed to enable His Majesty to take such " measures, and to make such augmentation of His "Majesty's forces, as may eventually be necessary

" on this occasion. "That we trust that the justice of His Majesty's demands will enforce, from the wildom and equity of the Catholic King, the fatisfaction which is " so imquestionably due to His Majesty; and that " we shall fincerely rejoice in such a termination of so the difcussions now depending, as may prevent any grounds of milunderstanding in future, and formay continue and confirm that harmony and

friendthip which has happily subsited between "Great Britain and Spain; but that we, at the same

" time, feel it our indispensable duty to assure His

"Majesty of the determination of his faithful Com-" mons,
