Flying washed in at 1000 hours. Out at 1200 hours. Flying time 81:50 hours. Flying was washed out at noon today for the Wings Parade.</p> <p>Edenvale: Flying washed in at 0800 hours. Out at 1500 hours. Flying time 10:10 hours.</p> <p>A Wings Parade was held on the Parade Square at 1600 hours today for the purpose of presenting wings to the graduates of Course 102 of the Air Training Plan. Wing Commander A.J. Vincent presented the wings to the graduates in the absence of Wing Commander W.G. Welstead, the Commanding Officer, who is at present on leave. Personnel were formed up on the Sports' Field in three Squadrons where they were sized and equalized before marching to the parade square to form a hollow square independently. For the first time the graduates were allowed to wear their three stripes on the Wings' Parade. Following the ceremony refreshments were served to the personnel of the Wings Party and their relatives and friends. There were 63 graduates in all:- 44 R.C.A.F., 9 R.A.F., 10 Australians, which makes a total of 63. The wastage on the course was 6 R.C.A.F., 1 R.A.A.F. and 1 R.A.F., totalling 8. The intake of Course 102 was 50 R.C.A.F., 10 R.A.F. and 11 R.A.A.F., making a total of 71.
