

Extract of a letter from Captain James
Ditz Gibbon, late, of the Glengary Light Infantry
Regiment, to William J. Kerr, dated York, W. Canada
30 March 1818.

"With respect to the affair with Colonel
"Brother not a shot was fired on our side
"by any but the Indians. They beat the
"American Detachment into a state of terror
"and the only share I claim is the taking
"advantage of a favourable moment to offer
"them protection from the Tomahawk & the
"scalping knife: — The Indians Depart.
"did all the rest."
