OTTAWA, 1to November, 1905.

Gentlemen:-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo, requesting information about the area of The Whitefish Lake Reserve Limit and the ground rent and fee payable thereon if any.

In reply I have to inform you that the area of the Limit assigned to the Bank is 62.11 square miles and the annual ground rent payable thereon is \$187.00. The annual renewal fee is \$2.00.

No returns of timber cut on this Limit appear to have been received by the Department since the season of 1900-1901 and the last payment of ground rent and fee received was for 1902-3, which leaves \$378.00 due to 30th April last, in addition to the dues on timber cut.

You were advised under date of the 26th of August 1903, that no renewal of any License could be granted under the Timber Regulations of this Department unless the limit covered thereby had been properly worked during the preceding season, or sufficient and satisfactory reason were given under oath for the non-working of the Limit.

You were also informed that you would be allowed to remove the Timber covered by the License until the 30th of April 1905, on which date the License would cease and determine without further notice.
