"These young men should be made to remove from the Reserve, but in view of the fact that they were honorably discharged from an Industrial School, the Department would take into consideration the question of giving them some assistance towards starting house-keeping outside the Reserve, provided of course, that they settle down permanently and give evidence that they intend to lead lives of industry. You should, therefore, endeavor to keep in touch with these young men after they leave the reserve so as to be able to report on their case to the Department.
