*Reserve, but in view of the fact that they were honorably dis sharged from an Industrial School, the Department would take into consideration the question of giving them some assistance stowards starting house-keeping outside the Reserve, provided for course, that they settle down permanently and give evidence that they intend to lead lives of industry. You should, there fore, endeavor to keep in touch with these young men after they leave the reserve so as to be able to report on their case to the Department.
