Sir-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th Instant, regarding desire of Joseph W. King to have the lease of his land (No 107) held by Melles Monture, cancelled, and in reply have to request you to be good enough to state whether, or not, you would recommend that action be taken, as desired, and, if so, from what date you would recommend the cancellation of lease, as, if Monture, is undesirable as a tenant, it would seem inadvisable that he should be allowed to remain in possession of the land any longer than is necessary.
