

on the Reserve and that it meets with the approval of the Department.

7.8 & 9. The Department also approves of the action taken by the Council in the cases of Mrs Latham and Joseph Hill and the purchase of School supplies.

10. That the papers presented by Mr Harry W. Martin in support of his application for enfranchisement are not in order. The Act should be strictly followed in such cases. The papers are herewith returned.

11th. That the Department approves of the action of the Council in refusing the application for a loan of \$50,000 for distribution among its members.

12th. That the Department will await the presentation of the papers in the matter of the controversy between the Six Nations and the Mississaugas in reference to lands occupied by the latter.

13 & 14. The Department also approves of the action taken in regard to sanitary matters and school attendance

15. As regards the salary of William Reep, the Department concurs in the proposal to increase the same to \$500 per Annum.

16. You have already been advised with regard to the proposed repairs to the Council House and of the approval of the Department therein.

17. Land disputes, I have noted what you say in this matter and will await your report of the investigation proposed to be held.

18. You may accept the Tender of Samuel John to supply wood for the Thomas School and you may have the wood delivered at once.
