I think the information I have given will make Mrs. Woikin's case quite clear. One thing I would point out is that, so far as our information at present discloses, the associations and influences that led Mrs. Woikin to become concerned in the investigation occurred after and not before her employment. The possibility of this has to be recognized as one of the limitations upon the protection of any investigation that may be conducted as a prerequisite to employment.
