CIRCULAR D. 23.

Circular D. 23. Most Secret. Following for your Prime Minister, Begins:

His Majesty's Ambassador at Brussels was informed at midnight on January 13th by Belgian Ministry for Foreign Affairs that Belgian Government had grave reason to expect immediate attack by the German Army along the whole line, Holland-Belgian-Luxemburg, and that in such eventuality the Belgian Government would look to United Kingdom and French Governments to support them.

2. His Majesty's Ambassador has been instructed to inform Belgian Government that His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom are determined to fulfil undertaking of assistance given Belgian Government and that in view of situation it is vitally necessary that Angle-French-Belgian staff conversations should immediately take place.
