- Band Douglas or Port Douglas.
- Tribe Lower Lillooet
- Stock or Linguistic Family Intero Salish
- Population The Inds give an estimate of abt ~~200~~²⁰⁰ for the Douglas, Skookum Chuck, & Samahquam bands. The Royal Com. gives for Douglas band according to Ind 70 + according to agent 60
- Chief occupations Same as ~~the~~^{other} Lower Lillooet bands
- Chief products sold. abt same as lower Lillooet bands but ~~no stocks~~
- Markets Chiefly local & restricted
- Number of stock 40 head of horses & cattle (shows an increase since time of R.C.)
- Number of reserves 6
- Area do 1334 acres = per. cap. 19 acres.
- Valuation do ~~from R.C. (page 129)~~ ^{by} 27,000 = abt 38²⁰ per. cap.
- Location & condition }
Facilities of access &c. } ~~See~~ R.C. Report
- Situation as to climate & altitude &c. low & good, but most of soil light or gravelly thus requiring some irrigation
- What best adapted for mixed farming &c. (same as other Lillooet reserves)
- Approx prop unfit for cultivation Prob. over 80 p.c.
- " " cultivable " abt. 10 p.c. or per. cap. abt. 2 1/4 acres.
- " " cultivated abt. 1/2 of the cultivable area or all this is water for
- " " Timbered Most of the non cultivable parts of the reserves are timbered but only a small proportion is merchantable grade.

Remarks on The reserves of the Douglas band are of very poor
the Reserves quality. The main reserve No 8. 1030 acres. is mostly bluffs & rocks of very little value except for the timber on it. The lower parts which when cleared are cultivable have been very badly cut up by the
