

- Q. What was the name of the doctor?
- A. Dr Christie.
- Q. And when he came to see you he charged you for medicine?
- A. Yes, and he charged us for his visit.
- Q. You have five reserves here?
- A. Yes.
- Q. No. 1 Reserve is the one we are on now?
- A. Yes.
- Q. And that reserve contains about 919 acres. Is that correct?
- A. Yes.
- Q. And you cultivate some land on this reserve, do you?
- A. Just a few of us do; we have no water.
- Q. How much land do you cultivate here?
- A. About 18 or 19 acres.
- Q. What do you grow on that land?
- A. Hay and garden stuff.
- Q. Do you grow any fruit?
- A. Yes, there are some trees on some of the places.
- Q. Do you cultivate all the land on this reserve that can be ploughed?
- A. If we had enough water there is lots of land that can be cultivated, but we are cultivating all we can.
- Q. About how much of this land is good land if it had water on it?
- A. The low land around the village, about 40 or 50 acres, is good land.
- Q. You have sufficient water records for this reserve; is there no water in these creeks that you can get water from?
- A. These are all springs, and they dry up in the summer.
- Q. Is there any creek near that water might be got from?
- A. We have one spring up here about 4 miles up on the hills, and the people down in the town have been stopping us because when we run the water down it makes the town creek dirty.

Mr Commissioner McKenna: Does the town get its water out of the same creek?
