he discusses the possi ility of their being of the nature of Caunopora. The net the character of the coenosteum, and the existence of more or less distinct laminae removes the species from Labechia, even if the tubes are not really hollow. (It is always possible that this appearance is the result of mineralization.) It is certainly not to be placed under Actinostroma as there is no sign of the hexactinellid arrangement of the horizontal bars and the resulting angular network. If my conclusions are correct we have in this species the first recorded Hermatostroma in America and also the first in the Silurian. Out of a large collection only two specimens were found, both from Elora; it may therefore be concluded that Hermatostroma guelphica is a rare form.
