

Holstein-Friesian Association of America Meet

The annual meeting of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America was held at Detroit on the 7th day of June. This association represents a life membership of about 8,000 persons resident in all parts of the United States and is engaged in the breeding of Holstein-Friesian cattle, of which it is now estimated that there are something over 300,000 in the United States, owned by approximately 30,000 people. Of the associations concerned in the production of dairy cattle, this is the largest in the world, and was first organized in 1871. It has in cash on hand \$215,593.43, and an annual income of \$230,806.28.

From Athens in his address stated that the meeting was the forty-fifth anniversary of the foundation of the Herd-Book of the breed of cattle. He paid tribute to the large attendance and the unequalled volume of the transactions of dairy cattle breed associations put together.

He recommended that census of the ownership of all the registered Holstein-Friesian cattle in America be made during the coming year; and that, as a means of spreading the doctrine of the Holstein-Friesian and local Holstein associations be closely affiliated with the national organization and an appropriation should be devoted to the expense of a tour of speakers to attend the meetings of the milk organizations.

He touched upon the importance of maintaining the true type of the breed, as shown by the scale of points, and stated that the high production, vigor, hardiness and constitution of the breed not kept in mind.

As an instance of the dual purpose value of the Holstein, he noted the record sale of a Holstein cow in St. Paul, Minn., for \$100,000.00, and a bull for \$118,000.00. He also noted that the largest yearling bull ever sold for \$100,000.00, and a cow for \$100,000.00.

Mr. Alton stated that a Holstein cow, to exceed a record in all classes to-day, is starting a year of lactation with a cow that produced more than 44.42 lbs. in a year. A two-year-old cow must produce more than 21.4 lbs. better in 7 days and 1.66 lbs. better in one month. He stated that entries in the Standard Registry for the year exceeded 12,000.

The report of the Treasurer, Wm. R. Smith, of Syracuse, New York, showed total cash receipts for the year of \$2,050,000.00, and disbursements of \$1,770,000.00. The balance of cash on hand, including reserve and cash accounts in addition to what there was a bond investment of \$52,861.25.

The report of Secretary F. H. Houghton, of Brattleboro, Vermont, indicated the largest annual business yet transacted. It showed an increase to 1,260 lbs. membership, bringing total up to 8,385. Registrations of cattle under the year of 1915 and 85,168 transfers were made. The total year's income from these sources showed \$265,959.41. The balance after paying all expenses amounted to \$119,344. An appropriation of \$38,500 was expended in 1915 during the year.

The report of the Superintendent of Delaware, Wm. H. Gardner, showed that during the year for milk and butter yield averaged 16.0 lbs. of milk and 14.0 lbs. of butter per lb. of milk.

The largest butter record of the year was that of a cow owned in New York state, named Ormsby Jane Sept. Agency, with a yield of 35.3 lbs. butter in 7 days.

The largest record for one year was made by a cow owned in Michigan, named Duchess Skylark Ormsby, the said being the world's record for all breeds of 1,206.03 lbs. butter.
