RIGHT TO CROP.

A owns a farm. B rents it for two years. He sowed wheat in the fall, as his time is out in the spring. A buys B's share of the wheat. C comes on the place in the spring for one year, when B leaves, and does not get or take any of this wheat. Now C sowed wheat last fall. Since that A has sold the farm to D.

What share does D get? Or can C take it all? N. E. B.

Ontario.

Ans.-The statement does not make the important dates at all clear, but assuming that it is the expected crop from the fall sowing of 1908 that is in question, we would say that D takes it, unless A in making his agreement with D, reserved such crop for C's benefit.

HOLIDAYS FOR HIRED MAN.

A young man hires for eight months, nothing being said about holidays. How many holidays (and which are they) is FARMER. he entitled to?

Ans.-In the absence of agreement to the contrary, hired help in Ontario is entitled to all Sundays and to New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Victoria Day (May 24), Dominion Day (July 1), Labor Day (1st Monday in September), Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and any other day or days proclaimed by the Governor-General or the Lieutenant-Governor as a public holiday. If, however, a hired man and his employer cannot arrange to do the work without resorting to the strict letter of he law, it is well that they cease laboring on the same farm.

It is understood, of course, that these holidays are to be taken subject to the doing of usual chores.

ECZEMA AND SCRATCHES.

1. Heavy draft horse has itchy legs both hind and front. Is cleaned daily, but keeps scratching against wall. also has appearance of scratches below What is the cure?

2. What would you feed a young team (working steady) with their oats, in place of bran, as it is dear and we have no roots?

3. Horses had mange in our stable a few years ago, and ever since we have had trouble with itch. Would you advise whitewashing? Would it rub off on "JERRY."

Ans.-1. The symptoms are those of eczema, treatment for which is thorough washing of the parts first with warm soft-soap suds, then wash with a warm solution of corrosive sublimate, 40 grains to a quart of rain water. As the horse appears to have scratches also it would be good practice to first purge him with a ball consisting of ten drams aloes and wo drams ginger, which your druggis will make up for you. Horse should be fed bran-mashes only for 24 hours before administering purgative and for same time after. After purgation ceases give one and a half ounces Fowler's Solution of Arsenic twice daily for a week. For scratches on heels and legs, apply warm poultices of linseed meal with a little powdered charcoal mixed, renewed every six or eight hours, then dress three times daily with a lotion consisting of 1 ounce each of sulphate of zinc and acetate of lead and 2 drams carbolic acid to a pint of water.

2. Feed with the evening meal a little oil-cake meal, say half a pound to the team to begin with, and mix with cut nay or straw or chaff.

3. Take one-half bushel of lump lime slack with boiling water, make into a milk and strain through a fine sieve Add to this a peck of salt dissolved in warm water, three pounds of rice boiled to a paste and stirred in while hot, half a pound of Spanish whiting, and one pound of glue previously dissolved in a glue pot over a slow fire. To this mixture add five gallons of hot water, stir it well and let stand for a few days where it will not freeze. This mixture is best applied hot, and a pint will cover a square yard. If a less quantity than above is required, of course the quantities of each may be cut in two or otherwise reduced This wash will not rub off.
