The resolution granting £37,000 for the ordinary Road and Bridge services for the present year, and the resolution granting £500 towards the completion of the new road from Bridge-water to Mills Village in the county of Lunenburg were read a second time, and finally passed.

A bill was read at the Court of Sessions, before the Grand Jury yesterday, to incorporate a Company for the construction of another Suspension Bridge to cross the river St. John. It is to commence in the neighbourhood of Mr. Hays' ship-yard, Straight Shore—pass over Navy Island, and terminate at Fort Neck, near the foot of King Street. The cost is estimated at £100,000. Our enterprising fellow-citizen, Mr. W. K. Reynolds is the projector.
