E. M. Macdonald's Motion to "Hoist" C.N.R. Proposals is Voted Down With Bennett and Nickle Lined Up in Opposition.

OTTAWA, May 20.—By a majority of 41 the Government last night was upheld in the first vote upon the Canadian Northern legislation. E. M. Macdonald's motion for the six months' hoist was defeated on division. Yeas 64; nays, 111.
