

He should, also, spray as nearly as possible : the time suggested. A delay of a few tys may mean practi-cally the loss of the mixture or solution to either the Dominion or Pro vincial Departments of Agriculture for a Spray Calendar.—W. T. Macoun, Do-Horticulturist.

Pour over the rabbit and serve at once.

The best way for keeping butter through the winter is to pack it hard in stone jars, pressing out all the

in stone jars, pressing out all the water possible. Over the top lay a generous square of wet cheesecloth and cover with a layer of fine salt. Every time the salt is lifted for butter to be taken out, smooth the top of the butter and cover again carefully.

For freezing any mixture, use salt and ice in the proportion of one part to three parts, respectively. For packing frozen dishes use one part salt to four parts ice.


