Tapeworms Make Pearls. Tapeworms Make Pearls.

Professor Herdman's recent investigations on the subject of pearl formation have yielded some interesting conclusions. In the great majority of cases it appears that the pearl is due to the presence in the oyster of a marine tapeworm. When the spherical larva of the worm dies nacreous matter is deposited around it, and the resulting mass is known as a pearl. The is deposited around it, and the resulting mass is known as a pearl. The life history of the tapeworm is continued in the bodies of certain species of filefish which prey on the oysters. These filefish, again, are devoured by fish eating rays or sharks. In these latter the tapeworm becomes mature and sets free numerous embryos into the sea. These finally enter the oysters and so complete the life cycle.—London Globe.

Japanese Paper Making. Japanese Paper Making.

The striking point in the manufacture of Japanese paper is the absence of machinery. Everything is done by manual labor. Factories are almost unknown, the industry being carried on in a small way by each family separately. Except where the members of a family are insufficient, there is no hired labor, and consequently paper making families are less affected by the rise and fall in prices which follow the variation in the demand. Lately one or two paper mills have been erected, notably in Osaka and Oli, a suburb of Tokio.

Walking For a Thousand Hours.

The latest remarkable feat in walking has just been accomplished in Manchester. For forty-one days and nights William Buckler, aged fifty-six, an ex-sallor, tramped around the track at the Ardwick athletic ground and completed his two miles and fifty-eight yards each consecutive hour, the total distance traversed in the thousand hours being over 2,028 miles.
